TOWN OF ARBORG BY-LAW NO. 7-2002

Being a by-law of the Town of Arborg to regulate the use of firearms

WHEREAS Section 232(1) of The Municipal Act provides (in part) as follows:

A Council may pass by-laws for municipal purposes respecting the following matters:

- (a) the safety, health, protection and well-being of people and the safety and protection of property;
- (j) the sale and use of firecrackers and other fireworks, the use of rifles, guns and other firearms and the use of bows and arrows and other devices.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Town of Arborg, in open Council assembled, enacts as follows:

- 1. Subject to Section 2 hereof, no person shall fire a rifle, gun, revolver, pistol, pellet gun or other firearm within the boundaries of the Town of Arborg.
- Section 1 shall not apply to individuals appointed by resolution of Council
 and approved by the RCMP to deal with pest control problems within the
 Town of Arborg.
- 3. No person shall use a catapult, sling, bow and arrow and other weapon within the boundaries of the Town of Arborg, except with the prior written permission of the Council of the Town of Arborg.
- 4. No person shall fire or set off fireballs, squibs, firecrackers or other fireworks within the boundaries of the Town of Arborg, except with the prior written permission of the Council of the Town of Arborg.
- 5. Every person who contravenes this by-law is guilty on an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of not more than \$500.00 or to imprisonment for a term of not more than three months, or both. Where a contravention continues for more than one day, the person is guilty of a separate offence for each day it continues.
- 6. By-law No. 10-64 of the Town of Arborg is hereby repealed.
